LOCAL STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN MANUFACTURING WEEK ACTIVITIES AT SIA

SIA celebrated Manufacturing Week, Oct. 1-5, by hosting nine schools and over 230 students. Held in conjunction with Greater Lafayette Commerce, the event is the local version of Manufacturing Day (aka. MFG Day) which, in its seventh year, was created to celebrate modern manufacturing and inspire the next generation of manufacturers.

Students participated in the SIA Educational Experience (SEE) tour, which included activities in SIA's new Learning and Discovery Lab. STEM activities in the lab include experiences with 3D printing, DOBOT Magician robotic arms, Cubelets modular robotic construction sets, and virtual reality (currently featuring a forklift simulator).

Last year, nearly 3,000 events took place across the country where manufacturers and educators opened their doors, offered plant tours and engaged their community. Thousands of students, parents, and teachers learned about the rewarding careers that manufacturing offers, and experienced first-hand about the high-tech innovations in 21st century manufacturing.

SIA PARTNERS WITH IN-MAC TO CREATE STEM LABORATORY FOR STUDENT TOUR GROUPS

SIA and Indiana Next Generation Manufacturing Competitiveness Center (IN-MaC) have partnered to create a STEM Learning and Discovery Laboratory. SIA is integrating the lab into its student tours to generate career awareness for Indiana youth.

The lab provides a variety of opportunities for K-12 educators, schools and youth to discover new ways to explore design-thinking and problem-solving using technology and creativity. Hands-on experiences include 3D printing, DOBOT Magician robotic arms, Cubelets modular robotic construction sets, and virtual reality (currently featuring a forklift simulator). The lesson modules for each activity were developed in partnership with Purdue and involve real-world actions that make sense to students.

IN-MaC is a joint center between Purdue's Polytechnic Institute and College of Engineering. It strives to provide programs and services to enhance the talents and capabilities of Indiana's present and future workforce.



FREE FLU SHOTS REMAIN AVAILABLE WHILE SUPPLIES LAST

There are still plenty of opportunities for you and your family to get a free flu shot. The full schedule of vaccine events is listed below, including the addition of two opportunities in Engine this week.

Any SIA or CTI Associate or on-site contractor is eligible to receive a free flu shot at all plant or Health & Wellness Center vaccination events. SIA Retirees and dependents of SIA Associates (must be at least five years-old) are eligible to receive free flu shots at the Health & Wellness Center vaccine events. Flu shots will be available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Should none of the vaccination events be convenient, all established patients at the SIA Health & Wellness Center can make an appointment there for a flu shot.

SIA FOUNDATION CELEBRATES NEW PLAY AREA AT CLEGG MEMORIAL GARDENS

With a \$10,000 grant from the SIA Foundation, NICHES Land Trust recently celebrated the opening of a natural playground at Clegg Memorial Gardens. The area gives children the opportunity to climb on large rocks and a tree log, while also discovering natural artifacts like antlers.

Clegg’s purpose is to focus on restoring and maintaining a native ecosystem, while protecting native species and removing invasive species. The garden is open to the public and is NICHES most frequently-visited property.

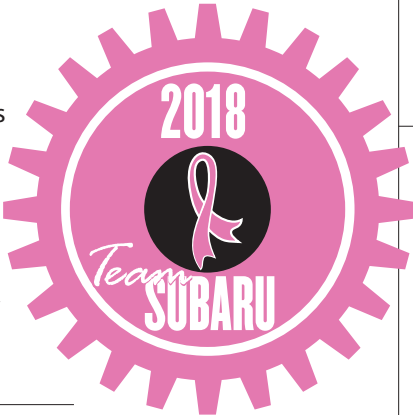
THANK YOU MILITARY VETERANS
